VANCOUVER - go2, the BC tourism industry's human resources association, is pleased to announce the recipients of its annual Scholarship and Bursary Program for post-secondary chef and cook training and tourism and hospitality management.

"By 2015 there will be around 12,000 new openings for cooks and chefs and 15,000 new management openings in the Food & Beverage and Accommodation sectors," said John Leschyson, Director, Industry Human Resource Development. "go2's bursaries help encourage student enrollment and training in these high-growth areas".

To further address this skilled labour shortage, go2 recently launched MOVE ON UP™, a province-wide awareness campaign to attract more people to careers in tourism. The campaign includes an interactive website, [www.MoveOnUp.ca](http://www.MoveOnUp.ca), with comprehensive information on tourism careers, including job descriptions, career profiles, salary levels, and training and education programs, as well as a job board linking job seekers with employers.

Eight students were selected to each receive a bursary valued at \$500.00. The selection criteria were based on overall attitude, industry aptitude, relevant industry experience, academic record, financial need and references. Applications were reviewed and final selections were made by a panel of industry representatives in conjunction with go2.
